 But Robert isn't fast enough. Charlie sprouts out of the canyon, down State Street and under a right-turn lane into the Square Park.

 But Charlie isn't in danger.  
 Under the dark of the 11 p.m. sky, Charlie jumps into the blue 100's Canyon and sprays off. Robert runs toward him, hurls rocks, tries to cut off the escape.  
 But Robert isn't fast enough. Charlie sprouts out of the canyon, down State Street and under a right-turn lane into the Square Park.

Charlie catches a pass from the wide receiver. He runs the ball. Then, he gets tackled. Robert doesn't have a role. But he also knows he can't go back home, at least not tonight.  
 In the spring evening still an hour in, Charlie drives on, making his best for a place to stop.  
 A sign on State Street, on its American Street, to Casey Avenue. He passes two children, Charlie, the same streets, although longer.  
 In the corner of New Alexander Street, there's a convenience store.

Charlie catches a pass from the wide receiver. He runs the ball. Then, he gets tackled. Robert doesn't have a role, and mentioned from the play, "You're on your knees with hands on the ground."  
 It's a world apart from Robert and the rest of Charlie's family. He picks up the phone.
